Location: 42 Lehigh Street, Westmont, Johnstown, Cambria County, Pa.

Description: A tall and narrow two-story, two-bay, single-family house with a front gable roof and a one-story, shed-roofed ell addition on the back. The wood-framed house measures 41'x 16' with a 10'x 13' back porch which has been enclosed. Resting on a sloping lot, the house has a wedged-shaped foundation to compensate for the uneven ground. Asphalt siding covers the exterior with exposed wooden trim. A shed-roofed porch has bracketed, turned wooden columns. An ornamental bracket is on either side of the front eaves. Wood-paneled lattice-work conceals the foundation in front.

According to a Westmont Borough building permit, the 1937 owner, William E. Robson, hired J. W. Walters & Sons, contractors, to replace the exterior stucco with stained shingles for \$500.

History: One of the ten six-room tenements built by Cambria Iron Company ca. 1889-91 at the cost of \$955.62 each. The house appears on an 1892 map of Westmont. The 1900 Census lists Joseph Locker as the tenant. Locker was a coal miner born in Pennsylvania in 1865. Both of his parents were German.

Louis O. and Minnie Wise purchased the house from Cambria Iron Company and Cambria Steel Company for \$2,000 on January 22, 1932. According to the 1905 city directory, Wise was a teamster. By 1918, he was listed as a machinist, living at this address. The 1922 tax assessment records also list him as a machinist and his wife as a housekeeper.
