President's Awards for Excellence in Service 2005

I am pleased to announce that Linus R. "Ron" Pryal has received the President's Award for Excellence in Service to the Community, and Jeanne M. Susko has received the President's Award for Excellence in Service to UPJ.

Ron joined UPJ in 1983 as a Machine Shop Supervisor in the Engineering Technology Division. Recognized for his extensive work on behalf of Somerset County Habitat for Humanity, Ron has been involved there as a volunteer for over ten years.

Jeanne, a 1985 alumna of UPJ, joined the staff in 1985 and is currently Coordinator of Community Programming, Outreach and Professional Services. Throughout her employment at UPJ, Jeanne has been actively involved in a number of projects, committees, and initiatives.

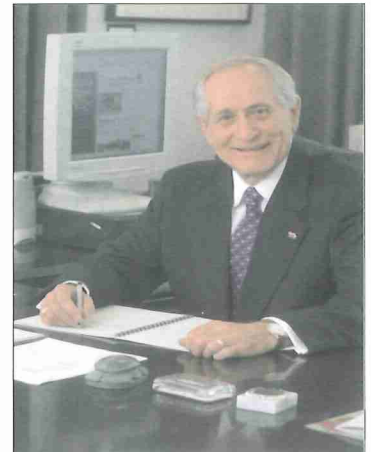

Andrea and Ron were among only a few staff within the entire University of Pittsburgh System to receive these prestigious awards.

Coach Gault Reaches 500th Win Milestone

On November 19, 2005, Head Coach Jodi Gault joined an elite group of NCAA Division II women's basketball coaches when her Lady Cats defeated Tiffin (Ohio) University, 81-71, at the University of Findlay (Ohio) Tournament.

With that win, Coach Gault became the eighth coach in Women's Division II Basketball history to reach 500 coaching victories. I presented Coach Gault with a plaque commemorating her milestone victory prior to the Lady Cats' 2005-06 home opener against Salem International (W.Va.) University on December 4. That day, Pitt Johnstown defeated the Tigers, 76-47, giving Coach Gault 504 career wins.

In her 24th season, Coach Gault has compiled a 504-143 overall record and has led her teams to 14 NCAA post-season tournaments. Her teams have averaged nearly 21 wins per season and have been nationally-ranked in 13 different seasons. Coach Gault's 504 victories and .780 winning percentage rank eighth all-time among Division II women's coaches.

1989 Alumna Speaks at Academic Honors Convocation

Cheryl L. Slade, a secondary education mathematics teacher in the North Star School District, Boswell, Pa., and a 1989 alumna, was the keynote speaker at this spring's Academic Honors Convocation. A resident of Stoystown, Pa., Mrs. Slade has received the title of Middle-Level Educator of the Year from the Pennsylvania Middle Schools Association. She also was named a Pennsylvania Higher Education Assistance Agency Scholar in Education and was listed in *Who's Who in American Education*.

Acquisition

At a meeting of the Johnstown College Advisory Council in August 1961, a committee headed by Charles W. Kunkle Jr. resolved "that the college immediately establish a building fund to receive gifts and grants for development and building purposes." At that meeting Dr. Theodore W. Biddle, first president of the Johnstown college, also announced "a gift of extensive acreage in Richland Township by the Wilmore Coal Company that might be used as a potential college campus." He placed a value of \$200,000 upon this gift of land.

An April 6, 1966, Johnstown *Tribune-Democrat* article describes how a land purchase was finalized. President Biddle detailed how a \$70,000 gift from the Pittsburgh, Pa., Richard K. Mellon Foundation was used to purchase an additional 316-acre tract.

At the dedication of the current campus in 1967, President Biddle said, "Many of us have watched the development of this new campus. We remember the site as a silent, remote woodland. We saw the bulldozing of clearings and smelled the pungent fires of smoking logs and underbrush. We watched with delight and unbelief as huge foundations emerged from the virgin earth. Soon structural steel loomed gaunt and skeletal against the woods and sky. Masons and carpenters came and buildings built for the ages took shape and form." He quoted 19th-century British critic John Ruskin in his dedicatory remarks: "When we build, let us think that we build forever."

Building Motif

When Dr. Biddle and Walter W. Krebs, the first Advisory Board chair, were spearheading the campaign for the new campus, they chose the fieldstone motif for the buildings. People say the rustic buildings amid the rolling hills of meadows and forests remind them more of a country club or resort than a college campus.

In a 1971 memorandum, Col. George W. Gage, Assistant to the President, said the stone used in the construction "...is a quartzite and was deposited in the early Cambrian period....The stone...was quarried by the Valley Forge Building Stone Company, Morgantown, Pa....The stone weighs approximately 189 pounds per

cubic foot...(and) is laid in what is called a rubble pattern. One ton, eight inches thick, was used for approximately 28 square feet of building wall."

Cemetery

On the southern slope of the campus, in a somewhat secluded section, you'll find one of Richland Township's largest private cemeteries, which contains nearly 85 graves. Traditional tombstones mark some graves, and others are marked by rocks unearthed by farmers. Sometimes the deceased's name or initials were carved in the stone.

George Hancock of the UPJ bookstore refers to this location as the Baumgardner Cemetery because that family lived there many years earlier. He came upon the cemetery several years ago and has since researched the plot. "Foundations, ruins and remnants of the Baumgardner farm house and out buildings are still visible today," Hancock reports. "Vegetation, shrubs, and trees hide some of the structure remnants."

Earthly Delights

On a walk through the campus' undeveloped acreage, hikers have sighted wild turkey, black bears, foxes, a variety of snakes, and white-tailed deer, along with the more common squirrels, chipmunks, skunks, crows, and wildflowers, mushrooms, plants, and trees "common to a mature, mixed, mesophytic, second growth forest," according to Dr. Dennis McNair, Professor of Biology. "The campus was timbered in the 1920s."

With woods and cemeteries come ghost stories. According to a report on "theshadowlands.net," a ghost of a small girl has been seen walking in the vicinity of the cemetery. Native American spirits are reportedly seen in areas adjacent to the soccer field. Rumor has it that, before the campus was built, there was a Native American burial mound on the site of the present campus. (But that's another story!)

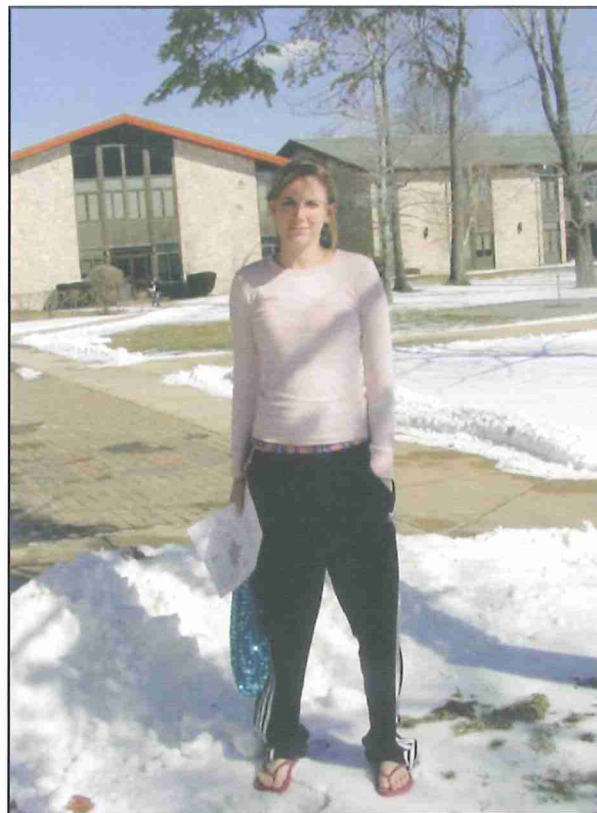
Chris Tartoni ('05) is working on his master's degree at Ohio University.

Mike Tomkowski ('00) works at the American Stock Exchange as a listing analyst and is also pursuing a master of business administration degree in finance at Pace University.

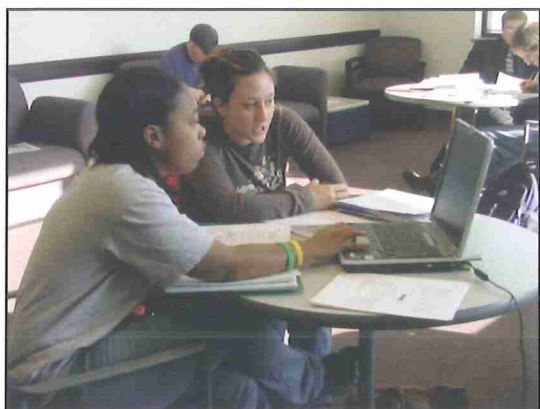

Where Are You Now?

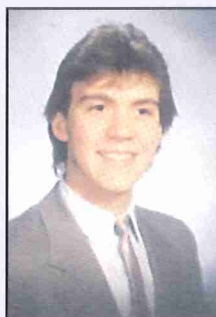
We received this response from the "Where Are You Now?" feature in the fall issue of *Veritas et Virtus*.

For all she was given, Johnstown alumna endows education scholarship

To say that Helen Zips Ayers ('43) has had a full life would be an understatement.

She is one of six children who lived on Coal Street in the Old Conemaugh Borough section of Johnstown. Helen credits her being among a select few students to receive a scholarship to "Junior Pitt" with providing an excellent background for a teaching career. The Johnstown High School Class of 1940 numbered more than 800 students.

Helen was the first of her family to attend college. University of Pittsburgh classes were held in the Johnstown High School building on Napoleon and Somerset streets downtown. After two years, students transferred to the Pittsburgh campus, where, in 1943, Helen earned a Bachelor of Science degree, majoring in English and business.

While attending a required class for teacher certification during the summer after graduation, she was hired by a fellow classmate who was the superintendent of Verona High School near Pittsburgh. She taught English and secretarial practice there for three years. During the summers, she honed her shorthand, typing, and bookkeeping skills working for a company of architects and engineers.

Her husband, Thomas Fry, whom she had met as a fellow student at Joseph Johns Junior High School, returned home from military service and completed his engineering degree at the Carnegie Institute of Technology in Pittsburgh. He became a professional engineer with Chester Engineers while Helen worked for the accounting firm, Main and Company. The couple moved to Erie when Thomas was assigned as project engineer on a job there.

When they returned to Pittsburgh, they settled in Bethel Park. Helen found a job with J. C. Keppie Company, diamond importers, on Liberty Avenue in downtown Pittsburgh. In addition to being an administrative assistant to the president, Helen took a

gemology course and assisted with grading and pricing diamonds. "This job was a most satisfying experience, and I left it reluctantly," Helen said.

She and Thomas moved to Illinois in 1960, where he was employed by Interscience Research Institute in Champaign-Urbana. Shortly after their move, he had a heart attack, and Helen decided to go back to work. She was hired as a secretary in the Office of Agricultural Communications at the University of Illinois. After her husband's death in 1966, Helen remained with the office, which offered short courses for farm and home advisors in the Cooperative Extension Service.

In 1973, she married Richard Ayers, and "inherited" his family of four sons and a daughter. "All the Ayers kids are University of Illinois graduates, as were their father and mother, and have gone on to graduate school and successful professions," she said proudly.

By the time Helen retired from the University of Illinois in 1977, she had become an assistant professor in the College of Agriculture. She collaborated with her boss, Professor Hadley Read, on a book, *Partners with India: Building Agricultural Universities*.

"My life was changed because of getting a college degree," Helen said. "If I hadn't received that scholarship to the University of Pittsburgh at Johnstown, I wouldn't have had all of these wonderful experiences."

In 2004, following the death of her second husband, Helen established the Helen Zips Ayers Scholarship Endowment at UPJ to support financially needy junior and senior education majors at the college.

She currently resides on a 1,000-acre farm in Bement, Ill., where her family grows corn and soybeans. She also serves on the board of directors of the family-owned business, Central Illinois Manufacturing Company, which is a major manufacturer of filters for the petroleum industry. Having 11 grandchildren and three great-grandchildren, Helen said, "I count my blessings."

On November 25, 2002, Asphalt Campus alumni Ed Kane orchestrated a farewell ceremony to the Asphalt Campus as the City of Johnstown began demolition of the Cypress Avenue Elementary School, site of the Johnstown College of the University of Pittsburgh from 1945 to 1967.

After the building was demolished, the Alumni Association made arrangements with Johnstown city manager and board member Jeff Silka ('89) to obtain a stack of Asphalt Campus bricks left over from the demolition, and board member Doug Oakley ('72), president of Airco Gas and Welding Supply of Johnstown, donated space to store the bricks. Ed came up with a



proposal for an Asphalt Campus memorial bench to be placed on the Richland Township campus, constructed in part with bricks from the old building.

Bob Blaschak ('87), UPJ Director of Administrative Construction, created a design for the bench. Construction is currently underway.

Thanks to the generosity of Asphalt Campus alumni, by this fall, alumni, visitors, students, faculty, and staff will be able to sit among the redbud tree grove at the foot of the campus mall, view the beauty of the campus, read, study, visit, or just reflect and remember their time at UPJ.
