I am pleased to tell you that Mark Nordenberg, chancellor, University of Pittsburgh, will speak at Commencement, scheduled for May 5, 2007.


UPJ alumnus **Kevin Pearson** ('99) will join us as the speaker at the Academic Honors Convocation, March 18, 2007.


### Sara Latta, Homecoming Queen

She got a job at The University of North Carolina's (UNC) main campus in Chapel Hill as a communications specialist. There she was able to work in cooperation





"I loved working at the Gallery on Saturday mornings In fact, going to work there never felt like work. I was amazed by the

talent and the creativity of the artists that were represented there." She quickly became interested in both the crafts themselves and in the historical tradition of fine craft in North Carolina. Four years after stepping foot in The North Carolina Crafts Gallery, Sara purchased the gallery and is now the sole proprietor. "Owning my own business is the hardest thing I've ever done. It's also the most rewarding," said Sara. "I feel very lucky to work in a profession that I'm so passionate about."

Sara's favorite part of the job is traveling to discover new artists and craftspeople and then buying their work for the Gallery. She currently represents over 500 artists and is always adding more. The North Carolina Crafts Gallery carries contemporary and traditional pottery, blown glass, turned wood, jewelry, metal art, folk art, garden sculpture, and fiber art, all handcrafted exclusively by North Carolinians.

Sara still keeps in touch with many of her college friends. "I talk to my two best girlfriends from UPJ, Wendy Santelli ('95) and Stephanie Floyd ('96) on a weekly basis. They are both doing great. I'm thankful for my long standing friendships with them," Sara noted.

### r. Albert L. Etheridge is Retiring


In announcing Dr. Albert L. Etheridge's retirement, Pitt Chancellor Mark A. Nordenberg praised both the commitment and the contributions Etheridge has made to UPI.

"During his tenure, Dr. Etheridge consistently has affirmed that UPI is grounded both in the creation of individual opportunity and in the strengthening of its home community," said Nordenberg. "He also has overseen a period of dramatic institutional growth, fostered a culture that encourages inspiring

examples of individual success, and created an environment that carries with it the promise of even more momentous days to come."

"I have very much enjoyed working with President Etheridge," said Pitt Provost James V. Maher. "Under his leadership, the University of Pittsburgh at Johnstown has developed the quality and size of its undergraduate student program and its physical facilities. He has shown unerring attention to the campus's mission to provide a high-quality education at a reasonable cost and to contribute to the important regional agenda of economic development."

Etheridge has directed more than \$20 million in improvements, with significant investments in academic facilities and residence halls, including Willow Residence Hall. He helped establish the school's \$10 million capital campaign, which has reached 100 percent of its original goal while creating two new giving traditions.

He also created the Excellence in Teaching and Service Awards, which recognize the value of faculty and staff contributions; established the school's chapter of the Phi Kappa Phi National Honor Society; and initiated a study that determined Pitt-Iohnstown's annual economic impact on its region is \$60 million and 600 jobs.

Under his leadership, UPJ has been recognized in the U.S. News & World Report

"America's Best Colleges" rankings as being third in the northern region among the top public institutions in the sub-category, Comprehensive Colleges/Bachelor's, in 2004, 2005, and 2006.

Etheridge also has served as a key contributor to the life of the Johnstown community, serving on the boards of Conemaugh and Good Samaritan Hospitals, the Joint Executive Committee of the Conemaugh Health System, the Community Foundation of Johnstown, the United Way of Greater Johnstown, and the Johnstown Area Regional Industries. Recently, he was one of 14 college presidents from the United States to participate in an inaugural meeting of

Cuban and U.S. colleges and universities to further develop an academic exchange between the two countries.



He began his faculty career at Louisiana State University and subsequently served as a visiting associate professor of zoology at the University of Texas at Austin and as professor of biology and then head of the Department of Natural Sciences at the University of Arkansas at Monticello (UAM),

which selected him as its 2005 Distinguished Alumnus of the Year. He became vice chancellor for academic affairs and graduate dean at UAM before accepting the position of provost and vice president for academic affairs at Nicholls State University in Thibodaux, La. He was appointed the fourth president of the University of Pittsburgh at Johnstown in 1994. Dr. Etheridge will retire on June 30, 2007.




Of Note: Faculty

Mike Yates, PhD, professor emeritus (Economics), has a book that came out in mid-January (his eighth book) entitled *Cheap Motels and a Hotplate:* An Economist's Travelogue (Monthly Review Press). Since his retirement in April 2001, he and his wife, Karen Korenoski, have been traveling the



United States, examining the country's great natural beauty and the state of its economy. They have lived in Yellowstone National Park (where Mike worked as a hotel desk clerk), Manhattan, Portland (Ore.), Miami Beach, and Estes Park (Colo.). In between, they just lived on the road, for months at a time, staying in cheap motels and cooking nearly all their meals on a two-burner hotplate. The book details what they did and what they have seen. It is a unique travel book, guiding readers not just to places worth seeing but to a greater understanding of how people are living—what jobs they do, whether they are getting richer or poorer, and whether or not their physical environments are deteriorating. Besides the towns and cities in which they lived for awhile, Dr. Yates writes about scores of other towns, including Johnstown and Pittsburgh and more than 30 national parks and monuments.








### Drafted in Maple Hall Jeff Schantz ('70)

The evening of the first of December 1969 was a cold one. Not unusually cold by Johnstown standards but cold enough to make you shiver when the front door to the common area in Maple Hall was held open too long. Or maybe the bunch of us crowded around the only TV in the place was just shivering from our growing anxiety. It seemed as if the whole contingent of dorm residents was crowded there, the fireplace blazing at our backs, all staring blankly at the small black-and-white TV set, dwarfed by the tall windows behind it that looked out on the cold, dark campus.

The Vietnam War was going full tilt. All of us had friends who were there. Many of us had lost friends there. Some of the dorm residents were even veterans of the war, attending Pitt on the GI Bill. We had all heard their stories, about the horrors of war, about the fear and the courage, and most of us were not at all interested in going there to see it for ourselves. Luckily, of course, we had student deferments and were excused from the draft because we were in college. That deferment, however, only lasted as long as we were in college. Once we graduated, or flunked out, it ended, and we were dumped into the uncertainty of potentially receiving an Order to Report for Induction, commonly referred to as a "draft notice."

On this cold night, however, this uncertainty was going to change. Tonight was the first-ever draft lottery, and the bunch of us crowded in the common area were about to witness the first drawing that would rank order who would go first and who would likely not ever get picked. Nonetheless, we were scared. Well, most of us anyway. The veterans among us seemed to enjoy our anxiety. They had been there and weren't at risk anymore. It was their stories, however, that stoked our anxiety. None of us wanted to see or experience the things they had told us. We didn't want to get drafted. We wanted to graduate from Pitt and get on with our lives. But some of us would likely flunk out, and what would happen tonight, could seal the fate of those who did.

Except for the crackle of the fire, the room was dead silent. All eyes were glued to the TV as Congressman Alexander Pirnie, R-N.Y., reached into a large glass bowl and selected the first blue plastic ball. The ball was broken open. All eyes were wide open and there was a collective gasp of breath. Each hoping it wasn't them.

An official read the little slip of paper, announcing clearly "14 September!" Then the hush was shattered by one trembling voice from behind the crowd, "Oh no, I'm gonna die!" As one, we all turned, and there, sinking to the floor, we found one of our friends, terrified about his future only because he was unlucky enough to be born on the 14th of September, and now, number one for the draft.

On that night, lives changed. We all stayed until our birthdays were announced, then retreated to our respective rooms. Those with low numbers pouted in misery, some called their parents for support, and some took comfort among their closest friends. Those with high numbers breathed easily, some even gloated, but not many. They understood the gravity of the moment and what it meant to their less fortunate friends.

"We didn't want to get drafted. We wanted to graduate from Pitt and get on with our lives."

So how did I do? I drew number 145. I was at risk since the government predicted that they would induct those with numbers as high as 190. But my grades were good, and I was planning to transfer to main campus at the end of my sophomore year to enter into the Air Force ROTC. But that night made a difference to all of us. We endured a collective traumatic experience and grew from it. The next day it was back to class, and, of course, the unpredictable diversions of dorm life.
