A SPECIAL MESSAGE FROM BISHOP

MARK: The U.S. Department of Health & Human Services recently announced that almost all employers—including Catholic employers—will be forced to offer their employees health coverage that includes sterilization, abortion-inducing drugs, and contraception. If the rule is not overturned, we will be compelled to either violate our consciences or to drop health coverage for our employees. I, along with my brother Bishops in the United States, have vowed to fight this unjust law. In the next edition of the Catholic Register, I will outline my concerns about this issue in greater detail and explain what you can do to help end this threat to our religious freedom. In the
