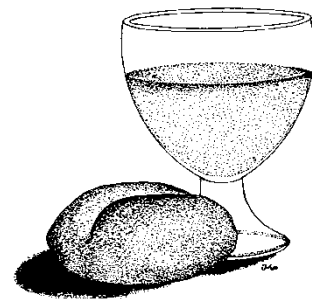
Dear Jesus,

Flesh and blood

Catholics believe in the doctrine of *transubstantiation*—that is, that bread and wine are changed into the Body and Blood of Christ in the Eucharist. The conversion is not merely symbolic, but actual, through the power of God. And not just Body and Blood, but the risen Christ as a whole is present in the sacrament. According to the Catechism of the Catholic Church, “The principal fruit of receiving the Eucharist in Holy Communion is an intimate union with Christ Jesus.” Don’t forget that the living Lord is always mysteriously in your midst.
