# Time to Work—Time to Play

For the Christian, work is sharing in the creative activity of God, building God's kingdom. Rest and play are also important. God gave us the Sabbath time for recreation. to admire our handiwork, and to thank God for giving us courage, perseverance, and creative talent to use in our work. Going out to work every day can be a pain. Getting up early, the commute, the monotony, and the tension of working with people who are unpleasant or uncooperative or both. Yet many people derive pleasure from their work, the companionship that often goes with it, and the knowledge that what they do is of benefit to others. Such people

experience the blessings of work which God originally intended.

Christian tradition has seen work in three ways: to support ourselves and those who depend upon us; to be in a position to help others less fortunate; and to develop the talents God has given us. Saint Paul made the point forcibly in his letter to the church at Thessalonika: "Anyone who will not work, let him not eat" (2 Thes 3:10). His criticism was directed not against those who could not work but toward those who refused work they were capable of.

For increasing numbers of people, with both partners working full time to pay the mortgage, keeping Sunday as a day of rest is becoming difficult.

In the Law of Moses, three thousand years ago, the Sabbath was introduced to protect the slaves and poor worker from being exploited. Conditions have changed. For many people who work in an office all week, hard physical work might be good exercise or a hobby. It is not what some might consider "servile work." For these people, putting the wash out on the line might be relaxation as well as necessary.

The important thing is to take time out from our work to praise God and to experience both rest and playfulness. In this way we not only honor God's command to keep the Sabbath holy, but nourish our dignity as human beings made in the image and likeness of God.
