
Perfect SAT for Prabhu



Perfect Scores in WordMasters Competition

WordMasters is a national contest encouraging growth in vocabulary and verbal reasoning. It takes place three times during the year with two divisions at each grade level. This national contest is designed to encourage growth in vocabulary and verbal reasoning. The WordMasters Challenge concentrates on higher-level word comprehension and logical abilities. For the contest, children are required to complete analogies based on relationships among words they have learned.

Congratulations to Nikhita Dharbhamulla in grade 7 and Shauna Hetrick in grade 5 who earned perfect scores on the third, and final, challenge meet, which was held in April. Approximately 40,000 students take the test at each grade level, but only about one per thousand students earns a perfect score. This was quite an accomplishment!

Students learn seventy-five words in preparation for these analogy tests. On the second test, **Benjamin Clark**, a fifth grade

student, and Laura Muchesko and Kyle Plummer, eighth grade students, each scored 19/20. These scores are remarkable when you consider that only 150 students in grade five scored that high out of the 44,980 fifth graders who took the test. In grade eight, only 160 of 28,320 scored that high.

Since our school has participated in WordMasters, beginning in the 1998/1999 school year, the students' scores at every grade level have increased dramatically. The English teachers at the middle school who have worked so diligently with their classes deserve our thanks and appreciation.

Read Across America

For the second consecutive year, the elementary school's students participated in the Read Across America campaign. The school's theme this year was "Proud To Be An American Reader." Each classroom teacher established a reading goal and recorded the children's progress during the month of March. Weekly themes encouraged the students to meet their goals. As students achieved their goals, they were recognized by having their names read during the morning announcements, having their reading pledge posters displayed in the school, and having the opportunity to select from a wide variety of

incentive rewards purchased with PTO funds. This reading campaign was held in conjunction with the opportunity to raise money for the Todd Beamer Foundation, established to aid families of the Flight 93 victims. The reading campaign ended with our Parade of American Heroes. The students and teachers dressed as their favorite American heroes while many parents and guests enjoyed a very special parade! Five hundred and nineteen students completed their reading goals for our "Proud To Be An American Reader" campaign. Students and faculty raised \$2143.00 for the Todd Beamer Foundation.



announce that four of our teams placed, returning with one first-place finish, two second-place finishes and one third-place finish from a field of fifty-five other teams. Read on, WHMS!



This year's competition marked the tenth anniversary of Math 24, a mental math "game" utilized to challenge those who wish to enhance their mathematical capabilities. This year's medal winners were Andrew Pozun (Grade 5 – a Silver Medalist), Jacob Seigh (Grade 6 – a Silver Medalist in the semi-final round and a Gold Medalist in the final round), and Alexander Pozun (grade 7 – a Bronze Medalist).

Jacob advanced to the PA State 24 Challenge Championship Finals in Harrisburg on June 12. At that competition, he was awarded a Silver Medal, finishing among the top 16 sixth grade students in the state.

Science and Language Arts Olympiads at the **Elementary School**




