

IN MILITARY HANDS. Gen. Hastings Issues Orders Organizing HIS CORPS OF WORKERS.

Two General Depots for Stores—Eleven Sub-Districts Established for the Distribution of Supplies—The Officers Who Are to Have Charge of the Various Departments—What Their Duties Will Be.

The State board has ordered all boards and other lumber suitable for fences and building purposes to be picked out and piled up as soon as possible, or it will be promptly burned.
