In its first sports promotion the Cambria County War Memorial is proud to present four of the finest school boy basketball teams in the state of Pennsylvania. This is but a sample of the fine attractions that will shortly be available to the people of Johnstown and Cambria County.

The War Memorial arena will be a living memorial to the men and women of Cambria County who have served in all wars. This impressive structure will not only be a tribute to past heroism, but its facilities will be the key to greater community progress in the future.

The Memorial has been aptly termed "the community's living room." Through its doors will pass thousands upon thousands of people to enjoy pleasures never before offered to the residents of the county. All forms of indoor sports including hockey, skating, and dancing will have a home in this building. Farm shows, industrial exhibitions, political conventions, religious gatherings and corporation activities will all be a part of the operation of the arena. The building has been designed to provide the maximum of utility.

The Memorial is scheduled for completion by October 1, 1950 and its cost will exceed \$1,100,000. Berkebile Bros. of Johnstown are the general contractors with Hunter, Caldwell and Campbell of Altoona being the architects.
