

ONCE again powerful schoolboy quintettes gather to do battle in the Cambria County War Memorial Arena. As in years past the area holiday season is brightened by the sparkling play of talented teen-agers, well coached. On no occasion throughout the Pennsylvania scholastic basketball campaign does as fine a quartette of high school teams meet under one roof in a night's play than in the War Memorial's Annual Invitational Tournament.

The Seventh Annual Invitational Tournament presents once more the cream of the current scholastic basketball crop, almost before the lid is lifted on the 1955-1956 season. Harvested in March for this December's event were four veteran clubs loaded with towering, tried and rugged veterans of the type that produce District, Regional and State Championships.

If the four team field of the Seventh Tournament holds true to the averages of the six years past, patrons of the Tourney will be seeing: (1) two first team 1955-56 All-State performers, as well as a second or third team choice, or both; (2) four teams whose 1955-56 season's records will read twenty-two wins and three losses; and (3) at least the runner-up to the State Champion, but more likely—the State Champion. Such is the caliber of ball in the oldest and finest of independent scholastic Tournaments in the Tri-State area.

On December 30th of last year, in the championship game of the Sixth Tournament, one of the most spectacular high school basketball games ever played in Pennsylvania resulted

in a tingling 75-74 victory for Overbrook High School of Philadelphia. Pitted against each other in this high school classic were McKeesport's Gene Danko, Stu Heller, and Tom Markovich, first, second and third team All-State-to-be respectively and Overbrook's first team All-State-to-be Wilt Chamberlain, seven foot, two inch giant. McKeesport eventually won the State Championship and Overbrook the rough-tough Phiadelphia City League Championship. Although scholastic classics of this quality are exceedingly rare this outstanding game is, never-the-less, an accurate measure of the stature and fierceness of the competition of the Arena's Annual Invitational Tournament. It is unlikely that Tourney stature will suffer on its seventh anniversary.

Chester High School returns to the field, after a year's lapse, with muscles bulging. Chester is looking for an important victory inasmuch as the Clippers lost to Johnstown in the Fifth Tournament championship 48-46 and went on to drop heart-breaking six point decisions in the State Championship finals in March of 1954 and 1955. Winners in 26 of 28 games last year the clipper ship boasts the return of Pennsylvania's greatest scholastic cager of the current season, the tremendous 6' 3" forward Horace Walker. A fine student and polished gentleman, Horace was unanimously chosen first team All-State in 1954-55 and to the first team All-American for 1955-56, to date his crowning achievement. As a sophomore in 1953-54 he was named second team All-State. Walker, who dunks the ball into the net with ease, dunked his 1000th point into Hanover's basket on Decem-

ber 20th. Complimenting Walker's great play is 6' 1" Gerry Gilbert, named eighth among schoolboy cagers the state over by Dell, and displaying great speed on the fast break, unerring eye. Center George Reeves rounds out the returning veterans at 6' 5"," giving Chester great strength off the boards.

New Castle (15-4), likewise, competed in the 1953 Tournament. A scintillating sophomore in the 1953 event blossomed into a steel spring-legged veteran last year to win first team All-State honors, the only other returnee beside Horace Walker, to scholastic basketball from the first team All-Pennsylvania of 1955. Holder of Pennsylvania's scholastic high jump record at 6' 534" New Castle's 6' 3" 190 pound center outjumps 6' 6" opponents effortlessly. Walter Mangham is, without reservation, New Castle's greatest cager in history, holding most of the school's marks and standing squarely behind Horace Walker as Pennsylvania's second ranking schoolboy hoopster. Mangham averaged an unbelievable thirty rebounds per game last year to rank nationally off the boards and averaged well over twenty points per game in Pennsylvania's roughest high school conference. Supporting Mangham in New Castle's bid for a State Championship are last year's starters: John Georges, 6' 1", 195 pounder, who rates the other half of the Hurricane one-two punch. A top shot, Georges sank 40% of his attempts in last year's campaign. Frank Bongivengo and Louis Farone, New Castle High School ballhawks, round out the returnees.

Entering its first Invitational Tournament Altoona High School (17-5) boasts the return of four of last year's first six veterans. Last season's three top scorers tread Altoona's hardwoods again. They are 5' 9" Earl Clouser, high scoring, left-handed floor leader; 5' 10" Chet White, hustling ball-hawk, who placed honorable mention on last year's All-State squad; and 6' 3" Jack Ray, top driver and rebounder. Behind these point-producers stands 6' Jim Swanner and 6' 5" Bill Ingram to consolidate Altoona gains.

Host Johnstown High School puts forth its fifth bid for the Tourney cup. Successful in half of the four previous bids, J. H. S. once again has great potential, both from its top J. V. squad of last year (21-1) and from last year's varsity (23-3) to mold a champion from. Returning regulars from the varsity include: the hero of the Fifth Tournament, 6' George Hanna, who dumped in last minute goals on both nights of the 1953 event to gain thin Trojan victory margins and the Tournament Championship. George is ranked among the top seven schoolboy cagers in Pennsylvania. Personal duels between Hanna, Mangham and Walker will bear great interest. Also returning is 6' 3" Dick Molchany, rugged veteran rebounder and goal-getter who, with 6' 5" Ben Haselrig returning, will give Johnstown enviable authority on the backboards. Spelling J. H. S.'s first five are 5' 9" hustling floormen Bob Hunter and Ken Rager.
